### **Committed to the Asylum**

Fontaine Maury, grandson of Mr. John A. Maury, former mayor of Washington, was sent to St. Elizabeth's Asylum for the Insane yesterday. On Saturday night he was arrested by Policeman Samson and lodged at the First precinct station, and yesterday he was examined by Police Surgeon Marbury as to his mental condition.

### *Friend Interested Themselves*

Friends, who had seemingly forgotten Maury during the two years he has been out of work, interested themselves in his behalf yesterday. Several persons called at the station, and it was only because it is thought that rest and medical treatment will do much to restore Maury to health that he was sent to the asylum. There he will be cared for and nursed back,, if possible, to his former state of health.

### *Formerly in P.O. Department*

Some years ago Maury was employed as a machinist in the Postoffice Department. Since he lost that position he has been a wanderer, without home and with few friends.
