J.S. McCarthy Dies; Masonic Past Master

James S. McCarthy 78, prominent Mason and former deputy United States marshal, died yesterday in a hospital here after an illness of more than one year. He lived at 2033 Thirty-seventh street N.W.

Mr. McCarthy was born in Eureka Springs, Miss., and came here in the 1890s. He was appointed a deputy United States marshal in 1926, and then studied law at Georgetown University at night, eventually becoming a member of the District Bar Association. He retired as a deputy marshal in 1942 and received an appointment for life from the bar group as librarian in District Court a position he resigned in February, 1948.

Mr. McCarthy was a past master of Washington Centennial Lodge of Masons and a member of Lafayette Chapter No. 5, Royal Arch Masons, Washington Commandery of Knights Templar and the Thirty-second Degree Scottish Rite Masons.

He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Mary Frayser McCarthy of the Thirty-seventh street address; a brother, Patrick H. McCarthy of Paterson, N.J., and a sister, Mrs. Allie Farmer of Green Cove, Va.

Masonic funeral services conducted by Washington Centennial Lodge will be held at 1:30 p.m., tomorrow at Joseph F. Birch Sons funeral home, 3034 M street N.W. Burial will be in Congressional Cemetery.
