Retired Railway Man to be Buried

James M. McCauley, Former Assistant Yardmaster of D.C. Terminal, Paid Final Tribute

James M. McCauley, former assistant yardmaster of Washington Terminal, who died at Sibley Hospital Wednesday, was to be buried this afternoon in Congressional Cemetery, after funeral services at 2:30 p.m. in the S.H. Hines funeral home.

A veteran railroad man, Mr. McCauley began as a brakeman with the Baltimore & Ohio Railroad and later became its assistant yardmaster. He had retired for some time. He aided in opening the present Union Station.

Mr. McCauley was a member of Federal Lodge, No. 1, F.A.A.M., and other Masonic bodies, including Royal Arch Chapter, Knights Templar and Almas Temple, A.A.O.N.M.S. He also was affiliated with Washington Railroad Square Club, of which he was a charter member; Edward J. Ross Council, No. 26, Jr. O.U.A.M., and Bill Doak Lodge, No. 584, Brotherhood of Railroad Trainmen, and former treasurer of Columbia Lodge, No. 484. He also held the office of counselor in Mount Vernon Chapter, No. 198, Trainmen's Auxiliary.

He is survived by five daughters, Edna M. Randolph, Ethel M. Chase, Mary M. Blatz, Mildred E. Reed and Louise M. Swan. His wife, Sarah J. McCauley, died some years ago.
