Benjamin McQuay Rites Tomorrow

Native of D.C. Was Active in Fraternal Circles

Funeral services for Benjamin Coombs McQuay, 72, notary public and secretary of the Glover Park Citizens Association for the past six years, who died at his residence, 3830 Beecher street northwest, Sunday after a lingering illness, will be held today at 2 p.m. in St. Mark's Evangelical Lutheran Church. Burial will be in Congressional Cemetery.

Mr. McQuay, a native Washingtonian, was active in fraternal orders.

He was a member of Lafayette Lodge of Masons and of Potomac Royal Arch Chapter, where he served as high priest in 1921. He was a past president of the convention of Anointed High Priests and a member of Calanthe Lodge of the Knights of Pythias. He had been secretary of the Masonic Veteran Association for many years, and was active in the affairs of St. Mark's Church.
