Shot Kills R.A. Milstead

Bricklayer Dies at Hospital From Wound Received at Home

Robert A. Milstead, a bricklayer, 1211 E street southeast, was shot through his head with a heavy caliber bullet at his home late last night and later died at the Casualty Hospital.

Mrs. Milstead was taken to the hospital with her husband and detained for examination.

At the hospital, however, she collapsed and could give no coherent account of the shooting.

Milstead was found unconscious in bed.
