### **The Cholera**

As already stated by us, some cases of cholera have occurred here within the past few days. Mrs. Herzberg, residing on C street, near 4 1/2, was taken several days ago with all the symptoms of the Asiatic cholera, but recovered under the treatment of Drs. Lindsley and Liebermann. Mr. Ebenezer Moore, aged 58, a clerk in the office of the Register of the Treasury, who resided at No. 469 C street, near 2d, was, on Wednesday night, attacked with symptoms of cholera, which rapidly increased in severity until collapse ensued. He remained in this condition for twelve hours, when his death took place. He was attended by Drs. Dexter and Dove. A case on Pennsylvania avenue, near 3d street, was reported this morning, but it has not yet been pronounced genuine Asiatic cholera. The cold weather will doubtless check the disease, and the season being far advanced, there are no apprehensions of its assuming the form of an epidemic.
