Captain Frank Munroe of the U.S. Marine Corps whose death took place at Vallejo, California on Sunday last was a native of this city and was well-known among our citizens as a genial, whole souled gentleman and a popular officer. He was a son of the late Columbus Monroe (who was a nephew of President Monroe) and a grandson of ex-mayor Seaton.

The Funeral of the late Capt. Frank Monroe of the U.S. marine corps, who died in California recently took place from St. John's (P.E.) church today, and was attended by a large number of officers of the army and navy and many of our leading citizens. The services were conducted by Rev. Dr. Lewis, assisted by Rev. Mr. Jackson and at the conclusion of the services the remains, under the escort of a detachment of U.S. marines, headed by the full marine band and under the command of Captain G.W. Collin, were taken to the Congressional Cemetery, where the interment was made. Major Graham and Lieut. Welles, of the marine corps; Lieut. Com. Tyler and Engineer Bayley, of the navy; Geo. Maxwell Woodhull, and M.H.R. Elliot, were the pallbearers.
