## **Deceased Citizens**

On Tuesday evening Dr. Owen Munson, formerly a well-known dentist, and for many years a resident of this city, died at his residence, No. 442 Ninth street, near G. During the war he served as surgeon of the 108th New York volunteers, and at its close accepted a position as a clerk in the General Land Office, which he held at the time of his death. He was the owner of a valuable tract of timber land and saw mill in Alabama, which was totally devastated during the war by the rebels; his loss being about \$30,000. He was one of the leading members of the Fourth Presbyterian church, and the Young Men's Christian Association, (who passed last night, at a special meeting, resolutions of condolence,) and Columbia Lodge No. 3, of Masons. The funeral is taken place this afternoon, being attended by Columbia Lodge of Masons and many friends.

## **Funerals**

Yesterday afternoon, the funeral of the late Dr. O. Munson took place from his late residence, on 9th street, and was very largely attended by the members of Columbia Lodge, No. 3, of Masons, of the Young Men's Christian Association, and friends of the family. The services at the house were conducted by Revs. Dr. J.C. Smith and Mr. Geo. H. Smyth, and at the grave by Mr. T.B. Campbell, Master of Columbia Lodge. The remains were placed in a vault at the Congressional Cemetery. Dr. A. Transue, Dr. S.S. Turner, H.N. Chapman, and C.D. Shepherd, on the part of the Masons and Moses Kelley, D. Basseth, M. Gill, and Stott, on the part of the friends, acted as pallbearers.
