Emory Nalley, thirty-eight, of 626 Virginia avenue southeast was drowned in the Eastern branch of the Potomac last night.

Efforts of two friends, James Ballinger of 67 I street southeast and James Albert Dyer of 610 D street southeast, who endeavored to save the drowning man when he was first attacked with cramps, were fruitless.

He cried for help, but disappeared before his friends could get to him.

The body was recovered almost two hours after the drowning took place by harbor policemen and was taken to the District morgue.
