Harry C Nash, Ex-Captain of Capitol Building Guides

Henry C. Nash, 69, retired captain of the Capitol guides who was a living library of Capitol lore, died Sunday in Providence Hospital of cancer.

Mr. Nash began his guide career when he was 23 years old, as an appointee of Vice President Marshall in the Wilson administration.

By the time he retired 40 years later he had squired everybody from Sophie Tucker to the Duke of Windsor through the historic halls.

"I suppose Harry was just about the best authority on the Capitol in the country," E.W. Johnson, sergeant at arms for the House, said.

"You could depend on his accuracy. He was careful of dates.

"He knew many members of both houses over the years. This was his life, and he was very enthusiastic about his job."
