Mrs. Parker Succumbs

Widow of S.G. Parker Lived Here Many Years

Mrs. Elizabeth R. Parker, widow of Samuel G. Parker, and for many years a resident of this city and Washington Grove, Md., died Sunday at the home of her sister, Mrs. Henry C. Miller, 1635 R street, after a short illness, Mrs. Parker was a lifelong member of the Episcopalian faith, being identified with St. Andrews Church and as one of the incorporators of the Episcopal Eye, Ear and Throat Hospital had taken an active interest in the affairs of that institution.

The death, a little more than a year ago of her older son, Robert E., following so closely the loss of her husband, was a severe shock, though she seemed to be in comparatively good health until the recent hot weather and up to the last few days continued to enjoy the frequent visits of a number of her old friends. She is survived by a son, Charles L. Parker, now engaged in business in South America, and two sisters, Mrs. Henry C. Miller and Mrs. Fannie W. Carlyle
