Ethel G. Pyne, 82, a concert singer, pianist, organist and artist, died Tuesday at the Chevy Chase Nursing and Convalescent Center.

Mrs. Pyne had sung in six languages in many cities in this country as well as abroad. She had been a singing teacher and a composer.

Born in New York City, Mrs. Pyne had taught school there before coming to the Washington area in 1935. She was the widow of Henry Rogers Pyne, a professor of Latin and Greek who died in 1953. She lived at 2737 Devonshire Pl. N.W.

Mrs. Pyne, who specialized in restoring art work, was the author of a book on her father's paintings, entitled "Otto Gaertner."

She was a member of the Arts Club of Washington, the Washington Club, the 20th Century Club, the Political Study Club, the International Platform Association and St. John's Episcopal Church.
