Will of Elizabeth T. Queen (dtd. Dec. 16, 1842, probated Jan. 9, 1843; Book 5, pp. 285-286; O.S. 2377; Box 16)

After all debts paid, my house and lot on I St., between 6th and 7th sts., to aunt Eliza Queen.

My house and lot on Capitol Hill to aunt Charlotte Queen.

My two lots near Queen's Chapel to aunts Eliza and Charlotte to be equally divided.

To two cousins Sarah Burr and Mary MacDaniel, \$400 each.

To aunt Ann MacDaniel, a set of teaspoons valued at \$24.

To widow Eliza Queen, \$250

To Henry Ann Queen, \$50

To three cousins: Mary Queen, Elizabeth Queen and Ann Brooks, \$100 each

To cousin William Queen, \$300 for his education and clothing

To Rev. Henry Myers, \$100; to Rev. J.P. Donelan, \$25; to St. Vincent's Orphan Asylum in this city, \$300; to Mrs. Maria Gregg, \$20; to my cousin Ann Maria Chever, \$50; my miniature of my father to my aunt Sarah Hughes.

To servants Capy [sic] Ann Underwood and her infants and to Adaline Campbell, their freedom from the day of my death; also to George Underwood, I give his freedom on condition that he serve Sarah T. Hughes until he attains age of 21 years.

Exrs. to compensate liberally Mr. Edward Simms for his services and kindness.

Remaining property to be equally divided among legal heirs.
