Funeral Rites Tomorrow For Harry J. Redfield

Funeral services will be held tomorrow afternoon for Harry J. Redfield, 81, retired Government Printing Office compositor, who died Monday at the Washington Sanitarium.

Mr. Redfield, who was born in Albany, N.Y., came to Washington as a child and was educated in the public schools here. He started in the printing business as compositor with The Star, where he remained for a short time before going to the Government Printing Office.

Retired from active work in 1925, Mr. Redfield who lived at 1219 Jefferson street N.W., was a past notable grand of the Columbia Lodge, No. 10, I.O.O.F.; a member of the Columbia Typographical Union, the Federal Lodge, No. 1, F.A.A.M., and of the Sons of the American Revolution.

He is survived by two sons, Walter L. Redfield of McLean Va., Arthur H. Redfield of Washington and a brother, Edward L. Redfield of East Falls Church, Va.

Services will be at 2 p.m. at the S.H. Hines Co. parlors Fourteenth and Harvard streets N.W. Burial will follow in Congressional Cemetery.

Funeral services for Harry J. Redfield, long-time Government Printing Office compositor, will be held this afternoon, with burial in Congressional Cemetery.

Mr. Redfield, 80, who made his home at 1219 Jefferson Street Northwest, died Monday at Washington Sanitarium after a few months' illness. He retired from the printing office in 1925.

Services will be held at 2 p.m. at S.H. Hines funeral home. He is survived by two sons, Arthur H. Redfield, Washington, and Walter L. Redfield, McLean, Va.; one brother, Edward L. Redfield, East Falls Church, Va.

A native of Albany, N.Y., Mr. Redfield came here in childhood. He was a member of Columbia Typographical Union, Federal lodge No. 1, of F.A.A.M.; Sons of the American Revolution, and was a past noble grand of Columbia Lodge No. 10, I.O.O.F.
