Injuries Were Fatal

Death of Isaiah Redmon Results from Accident

Isaiah Redmon, the yard conductor who fell from a car near Maryland avenue and 6th street yesterday and was seriously injured, died at Providence Hospital about 5 o'clock in the afternoon. The injured man, who was familiarly known as "Peter" Redmon, was assisting in making up the Boston express train at the time the accident occurred. He fell on the tracks and two cars passed over him, inflicting injuries which were declared to be necessarily fatal. Both legs were broken and Redmon was seriously hurt internally.

The deceased was 27 years old. His wife and four children survive him. They reside at 641 Maryland avenue southwest.

The body was removed to Lee's undertaking establishment last night and was prepared for burial. The funeral will take place from No. 1120 New Jersey avenue southeast at 4 o'clock tomorrow afternoon. Interment will be made at Congressional cemetery.
