Elbert E. Richmond Dies Following Long Illness

Had Been Employed in Treasury Department Twenty-Eight Years

Funeral Tomorrow



Elbert E. Richmond, sixty-one years old, a clerk in the Treasury Department for twenty-eight years, died yesterday afternoon at his home, 202 12th street southeast, following an illness of many months. Death was due to paralysis. Funeral services are to be held at the family residence tomorrow afternoon. Rev. G.F. Christian officiating. Interment will be in Congressional cemetery.

Mr. Richmond was born in Watervliet, N.Y., May 19, 1854. He passed the early part of his life in Cohoes, N.Y., coming to Washington when he was a young man. He was graduated from the Georgetown University Law School in 1897, and admitted to the bar of the Supreme Court of the District of Columbia October 6, 1897.

His wife, Mrs. Lura F. Richmond; his mother, Mrs. B.A. Babcock; a brother, Charles L. Richmond, and four children-- Elbert B. Richmond, Flossie G. Richmond, Carl H. Richmond and Mrs. B.R. Jacobs--survive him.
