Mrs. Roby's Death

Mother of Attorney MULLOWNEY Victim of Paralysis

Mrs. Amanda L. Roby, mother of Assistant District Attorney, A.R. MULLOWNEY, died at the Portner Flats yesterday afternoon about 4 o'clock. Mrs. Roby was a lovable and charitable woman, whose loss will be regretted by a host of friends. Mrs. Roby was the widow of the late Major George W. Roby, one of the victims of the Ford's Theater disaster of several years ago. He died several weeks after the collapse of the building from injuries received by being precipitated from one of the upper stories to the ground. Since the death of her husband Mrs. Roby had not enjoyed good health, and about a month ago her son, Mr. MULLOWNEY, engaged apartments at the Portner, thinking the change would be restful and beneficial to her. She had been in her new home only about a week when she was stricken with paralysis. For ten days before her death she was unconscious.

The deceased was 65 years old and leaves two children, Mrs. Annie L. Bertrand, a daughter, and Mr. MULLOWNEY. The former lives in San Francisco, and cannot reach here in time to attend the obsequies.

The funeral, which will take place tomorrow afternoon, will be private. The interment will be in Congressional cemetery.
