Francis V. Robinson, Veteran Clerk, Dies

Was Born at Mount Hope, Now Headquarters of Dumbarton Club.

An Active Charitable Worker

Francis V. Robinson, for fifty-five years a clerk in the auditor's office of the Treasury Department, died at his home, 1824 G street northwest, yesterday, at the age of seventy-six years. Funeral services will be held tomorrow at 3 o'clock at the late residence.

Mr. Robinson was well known to older Capital residents and was a member of a prominent Georgetown family, and was born in the family residence, Mount Hope, Georgetown, now known as the Dumbarton Club. He was a graduate of Georgetown University and was an active worker in charitable organizations here. He was treasurer of the Children's Home, on Grant road, for twenty-five years. His sister, Mrs. Thomas C. Cox, was a noted belle of Georgetown of fifty years ago.

He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Catherine Robinson. Honorary pallbearers at the funeral services tomorrow will be Leigh Robinson, Thomas Harrison, William Gordon, Henry E. Davis, Dr. Larkin W. Glazebrook, William R. Cox, Capt. E.E. Whiting and Charles Hume.
