Child Hit By Auto Dies From Injuries

Francis Rogers, Five Years Old, Ran in Front of Machine, Witnesses State; Other Accidents Francis Rogers, five years old, 1114 6th street southeast, was run down by an automobile yesterday afternoon, while playing in front of 408 M street southeast, and died at Providence Hospital about 3:30 o'clock this morning from injuries received.

Martin H. Kinsinger, 2113 Bryant street northeast, driver of the automobile, stopped his car and took the injured child to the hospital. Witnesses told the police that the automobile was not moving at an excessive speed. The child ran directly in front of it, it is said, making it impossible for Mr. Kinsinger to prevent the accident. He will appear at a coroner's inquest at the morgue this afternoon.
