Richard C. Rynex Dies

Retired Member of Pension Bureau Reviewing Board

Richard Caswell Rynex, retired member of the board of review, pension bureau, died last night at his home, 1523 16th street northwest. He had been a resident of Washington for forty years.

Mr. Rynex was born in Boston, Mass. He came to this city in 1882 and accepted a position in the pension bureau. He was retired from the government service last August.

He served as first lieutenant in the Quartermaster Corps, 23d Missouri Infantry, in the civil war.

Mr. Rynex is survived by two daughters, Dorothy and Minnie Lee Rynex; a son, J. Walter Rynex; a brother, S.F. Rynex, and six grandchildren and five great grandchildren. Mr. Rynex's wife, Mrs. Amanda Burns Rynex, died in this city in 1907.

Funeral services will be held tomorrow afternoon at 2 o'clock at his late residence.
