### **Samuel F. Rynex, 92, Union Veteran, Expires**

#### **Retired Dry Goods Merchant Survived by Two Sons and Two Daughters**

Samuel F. Rynex, 92 years old, Union Army veteran and long a resident of this city, died at the home of his daughter, Mrs. James L. Murphy, 1716 Lanier place, yesterday.

Mr. Rynex, who resided at the home of his daughter, Miss Byrd E. Rynex, 1826 Ontario place, had eaten breakfast at the residence of Mrs. Murphy and walked upstairs, where he was later found dead. Death was attributed to a heart attack.

Mr. Rynex was a member of the Association of Oldest Inhabitants of the District of Columbia and of the Grand Army of the Republic. He served with Missouri volunteers during the conflict between the North and South.

For many years Mr. Rynex was engaged in the dry goods business, first in South Washington and later at Nineteenth street and Pennsylvania avenue. He retired from business about 15 years ago.

Besides his daughters, Mr. Rynex is survived by two sons, Frank R. Rynex of Walter Heights, Va. and David C. Rynex of 1826 Ontario place.

Funeral services will be conducted at the residence on Ontario place tomorrow afternoon at 1:30 o'clock. Rev. J.H. Miers, pastor of the Fourth Presbyterian Church, of which Mr. Rynex was an elder, will officiate. Interment will be in Congressional Cemetery.
