Francis J. Scott Dies; Innkeeper 26 Years

Francis Jasper Scott, 62, proprietor of the Scott Inn, 1331 K street N.W. and former employe of the Bureau of Printing and Engraving, died suddenly Friday after a heart attack at his home, 1333 K street N.W.

Funeral services were to be held this afternoon at the Padgett funeral home, 131 Eleventh street S.E., with burial in Congressional Cemetery. Mr. Scott was born in Washington and educated in the public schools. He worked 18 years with the Bureau of Engraving and Printing and had operated the Scott Inn 26 years. He was founder and vice president of the Scott Gas Stove & Appliance Co.

Surviving are his widow, Mrs. Katie I. Clifton Scott; a sister, Mrs. Charles E. Speiden, and two brothers, George J. and Harry Scott, all of Washington.
