Heart Attack In Car Kills Retired Worker

Benjamin Seabourne, 52, a retired storage company foreman, died today of a heart attack while sitting in his car in an alley at the rear of 714 Eleventh street southeast. He previously had suffered occasional attacks, relatives told police.

Mr. Seabourne had driven from his home, 540 Eleventh Street southeast, with his brother-in-law, Nathan Lewis, to buy food to take to his mother's farm near Croome Station, Md. Lewis went into a bakery, leaving Mr. Seabourne in the car. When Lewis returned he found his brother-in-law unconscious. He died before a Casualty Hospital ambulance arrived. The body was taken to the District Morgue.

Surviving Mr. Seabourne are his widow, Mrs. Elizabeth Seabourne, and his mother, Mrs. S.J. Seabourne.
