Mrs. Carrie Sebring Dies; Widow of Ex-Police Aide

Mrs. Carrie H. Sebring, 84, of 5320 Colorado avenue N.W., widow of Francis A. Sebring, for many years chief clerk of the Police Court, died yesterday at Sibley Hospital after a month's illness. Mrs. Sebring, a native of Abia, Iowa, came to Washington at the age of 12 with her parents. She married Mr. Sebring, a prominent Mason and Police Court employee for 40 years in 1883. Mr. Sebring died seven years ago.

She is survived by two daughters, Mrs. Stephen O. Ford and Mrs. George P. Plummer, both of Washington.

Funeral services will be held at 3 p.m. Monday at the Hines funeral home. Burial will be in Congressional Cemetery.
