J.W. Shackelford, Pressman, Is Dead

United States News Employe Gave Up Law Career for Newspaper Job

James W. Shackelford 61, head of the press room of the United States News and a lifelong resident of Washington, died yesterday at his residence, 1725 Seventeenth street, after a brief illness.

A graduate of National Law School Mr. Shackelford gave up his careShackelford_JamesWer as a lawyer in October, 1905, when he joined the Washington Post as an apprentice pressman. After five years' service there he went to the Washington Herald where he worked for eight years.

During his study at National Law School Mr. Shackelford worked in the office of Dean & Himarsch, attorneys.

In 1918 he became foreman of the press room then printing Capper's Weekly. Four years later he was made head of the press room of the United States News, then the United States Daily. Mr. Shackelford is survived by his widow, Mrs. Belle E. Shackelford; three daughters, Mrs. Elizabeth A. Fogarty, Mrs. Clara M. Mayo of Washington and Mrs. Dorothy Lantz of Philadelphia; a brother, Charles D. Shackelford of this city and a sister, Mrs. Randolph Sandy of Colonia Beach, Va.
