## George C. Shaffer, 71, Florist for 50 Years, Falls Dead at Hotel

George C. Shaffer, Washington florist for nearly half a century, fell dead last night as he stepped from an elevator in the Kennedy-Warren apartment hotel after a visit with friends. Mr. Shaffer, 71, had left Doctors Hospital only last Wednesday, after spending a month there.

Dr. Joseph T. O'Hanlon, resident physician at Doctors Hospital, and Dr. Clayton Hawfield, Mr. Shaffer's family physician, were called to the scene. Mr. Shaffer was pronounced dead by Dr. O'Hanlon.

Mr. Shaffer was born in Oxon Hill, Md., and moved to Washington as a child. He first entered the florist business in 1900 and he had operated the store at 900 Fourteenth street N.W., for many years.

Mr. Shaffer was active in the Washington Board of Trade, the Scottish Rite Masons, the Elks, Odd Fellows and the Association of Oldest Inhabitants and was a member of the Congressional Country Club.

He had been in poor health for the past four years and twice had been hospitalized this year.

Mr. Shaffer is survived by one son, Clarence J. Shaffer, secretary-treasurer of the business his father headed. He lives at 2730 Wisconsin avenue N.W.

Also surviving are two sisters, Miss Iola Shaffer of 1803 Biltmore street N.W., and Mrs. Maude Crown of 7 Girard street N.E., and by one brother, Arthur Shaffer, 3311 Forty-sixth street S.E.

Mr. Shaffer's first wife died in 1916. He remarried in 1925 and his second wife died in 1936. The body is at Hysong's funeral home, 1300 N street N.W.
