Joseph J. Shallcross, 40, Dies After Long Illness

Joseph J. Shallcross, 40, an Internal Revenue Bureau employe for the last seven years, died yesterday at Providence Hospital after a long illness. He lived at 2034 Thirty-first place S.E.

Mr. Shallcross had been working in the revenue agent's office in Baltimore and commuting from Washington. Because of ill health he was to be transferred to the local office. The official transfer came through yesterday after his death.

Born in Baltimore, he had lived here since boyhood. As a young man, he worked in the old Loans and Currency Division of the Treasury Department. He left Government service and was with a private business firm until he joined the Internal Revenue Bureau.

He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Minnie Irene Shallcross; two sons, Pvt. Joseph J. Shallcross, jr., with the Army Air Forces in Amarillo, Tex., and Seaman 1/c Allen Paul Shallcross, with the Navy in Memphis, Tenn.; a daughter, Miss Katherine Anne Shallcross, Washington; his mother, Mrs. Mary A. Shallcross, Baltimore; two sisters, Miss Mary Shallcross and Miss Loretta Shallcross, Baltimore; a brother, Alan Shallcross, Baltimore; one grandson.

Requiem mass will be celebrated at 9 a.m. Saturday at St. Francis Xavier Church. Burial will be in Congressional Cemetery.
