Sudden Death

Mrs. Harriet Snedecker, seventy-two years old, died suddenly about 5 o'clock this morning at her home, 109 Harrison street, Anacostia. When she became ill Dr. R.A. Pyles was summoned, but death occurred before he reached the house. Her death resulted from natural causes and the necessary certificate was given.

Sudden death yesterday morning removed one of an aged couple, who, abiding alone in their declining years, were noted in this place for the peaceful quietude of their lives and their philosophical acceptance of good or ill as either befell them. Samuel Snedecker, her husband, is the proprietor of a little shoemaker shop, where the couple resided.
