Mr. Spence, who lived at 28 Lincoln Ave., Takoma Park, Md., died Friday at Atlantic City, N.J.

A native of Washington, he attended District public schools before going to work for the Southern Railroad, of which his father had been an official.

In 1917 he began his 29 years of service with the Veterans' Administration, known then as the Bureau of War Risks Insurance.
