Capt. M.B. Stelle Dies

Was Son of E.B. Stelle, Long Assistant Librarian of Congress

Capt. Morton B. Stelle, from 1880 until 1905 a member of the 7th Regiment, N.G.N.Y., a Washingtonian by birth, died yesterday in New York. He was the son of Edward B. and Adelide St. M. Hopkins Stelle. For thirty years his father was assistant librarian of Congress. Capt. Stelle's grandfather was prominently identified with the early history of the capital.

Capt. Stelle was educated in Washington and at Exeter Academy. He went to New York and founded a firm of fruit brokers. He entered the 7th Regiment as a private in Company F and was promoted to the captaincy of the company. He resigned from the regiment in 1905. He is survived by his widow and a son, Maj. M.B. Stelle, jr. Interment will be in Washington.
