Dr. E. Stevens Stricken

Dr. Edward Stevens of the Cordova apartment was stricken with heart disease on F street yesterday afternoon and died at the Emergency Hospital later in the evening. Dr. Nevitt District coroner, was called and issued a certificate of death from natural causes.

Dr. Stevens was a well known figure in Washington, having conducted a drug store at 9th street and Pennsylvania avenue for many years. He was born in the city sixty-five years ago, a member of an old Washington family, and lived here all his life. He was graduated from the University of Virginia.

Dr. Stevens is survived by his wife, Mrs. Hortense R. Stevens. He was a member of Pentalpha Lodge of Masons.

Funeral services will be held at St. Thomas Episcopal Church Monday at 11 o'clock. Interment will be at the Congressional cemetery.
