The remains of the late Thomas Stewart, gunner U.S.N., who died last Friday night, were yesterday at 4:30 p.m. buried at the Congressional cemetery with naval and civic honors. Services were held at the family residence and at the place of interment, Rev. Dr. Steele of St. Mark's Church officiating. The attendance of relatives and friends of the deceased was very large.

The remains of the dead seaman were escorted to their final resting place by a detail of marines and sailors from the Washington barracks and the navy yard, eight naval warrant officers, members of Kit Carson Post, No. 2, G.A.R.; Columbia Commandery, K.T., No. 2; Naval Lodge, No. 4, and Naval Chapter.

Funeral rites at the house after the Knights Templar custom were held, as were also ceremonies at the grave by the G.A.R. and the Masons. The pallbearers were Knights Templar. After the interment a salute of three guns was fired by marines in honor of the deceased.
