W.A. Storm Is Dead

Clerk in Construction Bureau, Navy Department Succumbs

William Arthur Storm, 54, clerk in the Bureau of Construction and Repair, Navy Department, for the past 11 years, died Tuesday at the residence of Mrs. Oscar H. Coumbe, 1127 Euclid street, where he had made his home. He was born in Meriden, Conn., and had resided in this city for the past 20 years.

He was a graduate of St. Lawrence University, Canton, N.Y. Mr. Storm was a member of Harmony Lodge No. 17, F.A.A.M., and past patron of Warren G. Harding Chapter, No. 31, O.E.S. He was choirmaster of St. Mark's Episcopal Church for 12 years and a vestryman of St. Andrew's Church. No immediate relatives survive.
