Young Sullivan was travelling alone in the car and was following a vehicle driven by Robert Morgan, 28, of 8851 Garland ave., Silver Spring. Morgan, night manager of the restaurant, was driving another employe home after all three had worked late.

The youth was graduated from St. John's College in 1957 and intended to go into the restaurant business with a friend in a few years, Dr. Sullivan said.

Besides his parents he is survived by two sisters, Barbara Ann, 15, and Virginia, 14, and a brother, Richard, 21, of 3700 Cumberland st. nw.
