Rites to Be Held Here for Louis Sunderlin, Former Tax Official

Funeral services for Louis K Sunderlin, 66, former officer of the Bureau of Internal Revenue, will be held at 2 p.m. Thursday at the Lee funeral home, Fourth street and Massachusetts avenue N.E. The place of burial has not been decided.

Mr. Sunderlin died Saturday in Jacksonville, Fla.

A Government worker for 44 years, he retired May 9 as chief of the taxpayers' ruling section of the income tax unit.

Mr. Sunderlin was born in Reed City, Mich. but lived most of his life in the District. In 1903 he entered Government service as stenographer at the Smithsonian Institution, later serving with the Bureau of Indian Affairs and the War Department.

Mr. Sunderlin received a law degree from George Washington University in 1908 and was admitted to practice before the Court of Appeals and the Supreme Court in the same year.

Soon afterward he joined the General Land Office and was assigned to Oregon as a special agent in the prosecution of land fraud. He returned to Washington as acting chief of the Division of Law Examiner in the Land Office.

He joined the Bureau of Internal Revenue as a claims examiner in 1920 and was promoted to the taxpayers' rulings section in 1938. Before moving to Florida, he lived at 3716 Fulton street N.W.

Mr. Sunderlin is survived by his widow, Mrs. Isabel Sunderlin, and a brother, Charles A. Sunderlin of Los Angeles.
