Miss Ellen F. Sydnor Dies as Result of Paralysis

Funeral services for Miss Ellen F. Sydnor, a hospital nurse during the civil war, who died at Garfield Hospital yesterday following an illness of about three weeks, will be held at 2 o'clock Monday afternoon at the home of her sister, Mrs. Fannie McDarrell, 2511 12th street northwest. Burial will be in Congressional cemetery.

Miss Sydnor was born in Winchester, Va., sixty-eight years ago. She had been a resident of Washington about thirty-five years. During the civil war she served as a nurse in an army hospital of the northern army at Winchester.

For a number of years Miss Sydnor was employed in the government printing office and the Treasury Department, having been appointed to government service by President McKinley. About six months ago a stroke of paralysis forced her to resign.

Miss Sydnor leaves four sisters all of whom live in this city. They are Miss Mollie C. Sydnor, Mrs. Fannie McDarrell, Mrs. E.J. Helm and Mrs. Annie Raun.
