## Mrs. Mary Teachum Dies; Helped Found Eastern Star

Mrs. Mary E. Teachum, 81, one of the founders of the District chapter of the Eastern Star Order and organizer of the local branch of Job's Daughters, died Monday at Sibley Hospital after a long illness.

She was born and lied all her life in the District's southeastern area. Her husband, the late William K. Teachum, was proprietor of a dry goods store in the area for more than 30 years. She was a member of Christ Episcopal Church.

Mrs. Teachum helped start the District chapter of the Eastern Star in 1892. She was made grand lecturer of the Grand Chapter in 1897, and continued in the office until 1944, when she became lecturer emeritus. She organized the Washington branch of Job's Daughters in 1923 and served for a number of years as its grand guardian.
