Funeral Scheduled For Miss Thomas, Teacher, D.C. Native

Funeral services for Miss Genevieve E. Thomas, a member of the research department of the District public schools, will be held at the S.H. Hines funeral home, 2901 Fourteenth street N.W., at 3:30 p.m. tomorrow. Burial will be in Congressional Cemetery.

Miss Thomas died Monday at Garfield Hospital after an illness of four months. She lived at 3120 Mount Pleasant street N.W.

A native of Washington and a lifelong resident, she began teaching in 1917. She taught at West Cooke, Brightwood and other elementary schools before entering the research department in 1933 as a remedial and testing instructor for the elementary schools in Georgetown.

She worked directly under Miss Bessie La Salle, assistant superintendent in charge of research for the District public schools.

She was a graduate of Wilson Normal School and George Washington University and attended Maryland University. She was a member of Chi Omega Sorority.

She also was a member of the National Education Association, the Education Association of the District of Columbia, the Research Club and the Calvary Methodist Church.

She is survived by her mother, Mrs. Jane E. Thomas, Washington; a sister, Mrs. A. Bryant Reavis, Swathmore, Pa., and a brother, Walter A. Thomas, Washington. She also has a niece, WAVE Ensign Genevieve Reavis, stationed at San Francisco.
