Dr. Henry C. Thompson Dies After Long Illness

Dental Surgeon and Former Lecturer in Columbian, Now G.W.U., Succumbs

Dr. Henry Clay Thompson, who practiced dental surgery in this city for a number of years, died at his home, 3500 13th street northwest yesterday, after an illness covering a period of three years. He was seventy-one years of age.

Funeral services will be held tomorrow afternoon at 2 o'clock, following which the interment, which will be private, will take place in the family vault at Congressional cemetery.

Dr. Thompson is survived by his wife, Josephine Koones Thompson; a daughter, Mrs. Fred W. Holt; a sister, Miss Amanda Thompson and a brother, Dr. Millard F. Thompson, all of this city, and a son, Henry Clay Thompson, jr. of Wilmington, Del.

Dr. Thompson was born in this city June 4, 1850. He was educated here and for twenty-eight years, part of which time he was dean, he was a lecturer in the dental school of Columbian, now George Washington University. He engaged in the active practice of his profession here for forty-seven years and gave it up only three years ago, when he suffered a nervous breakdown, from which he never recovered.

He compiled a book on oral hygiene, now used in the District public schools as a text book. He is a member of Dawson Masonic Lodge and of Columbia Commandery, Knights Templar. He was an elder in the Sixth Presbyterian Church for thirty-two years.
