**Pharmacist, 29 Years In Business, Expires
Wilson C. Thompson, Native of Delaware,
Resident of Washington Since He Was 15**

Wilson C. Thompson, registered pharmacist of this city for nearly 30 years, died at his home, 3026 Fifteenth street, yesterday.

Mr. Thompson was born in Delaware in 1871 and came to Washington at the age of 15. He worked for a number of years as apprentice in a drug store and about 1900 entered business for himself, at Fourteenth and Irving streets. He continued as proprietor of this store until 1910, when he entered partnership with F.V. Pitton, in a drug store at Fourteenth and Rhode Island avenue.

Mr. Thompson is survived by his widow, Mrs. Clara Mae Thompson, and a daughter, Mrs. Mae Cole.

Funeral services will be held at S.H. Hines Co's funeral home, 2901 Fourteenth street, tomorrow at 2 o'clock. Interment will follow at the Congressional Cemetery.
