The Funeral of W.H. Topping

whose death occurred in Baltimore the day before yesterday, as announced in our columns yesterday, took place from the late residence, on Thirteenth street, this morning at 10 o'clock. The remains arrived in the city at 5 o'clock p.m., yesterday, and were taken to the house. The only relatives of the deceased present were a sister (Miss M.A. Topping) and a niece (Mrs. Bonny), all the other relations being at a distance--James, a brother, in New York State, and Mrs. Malida and Miss Avionia Jones on a professional tour in California. The funeral services were performed by Rev. Dr. Pinkney of the Episcopal Church, in the presence of a numerous concourse of personal friends, who afterwards accompanied the remains to the Congressional Cemetery. The deceased was about forty years of age and had just returned from a tour to Cuba, which he had been induced to take for the benefit of his health.
