George A. Traylor Dies

Special Agent for Department of Labor Victim of Heart Disease

George A. Traylor, a special agent in the bureau of labor statistics of the Department of Labor, who lives at Falls Church, Va., died suddenly this morning at Philadelphia, where for the past three weeks he had been pursuing a special investigation for his bureau. The cause of death was heart disease, according to a message received at the bureau of labor statistics this afternoon.

The death of Mr. Traylor came as a shock to his fellow-workers in the bureau. He made daily reports of his investigations, and one received this morning showed that he worked yesterday.

Mr. Traylor was born at Richmond, Va., January 3, 1852 and had been in the government service since 1886 in the bureau of labor statistics, which, during the intervening period, has been known under many different names. He is survived by a wife and several children.
