Funeral

The funeral of Mr. Samuel R. Turner, whose death was mentioned in the Star on Friday, took place from his late residence on K street, between 6th and 7th streets, East Washington, yesterday afternoon at two o'clock, and was largely attended by Union Lodge and Magenenu Encampment, I.O.O.F., and by the clerks of the Navy Yard. The funeral services at the house were conducted by Rev. W.H. Holliday, and at the grave by Rich. Baxter, Chaplain of Union Lodge. The funeral procession was under the direction of P.G. Daniel Carrigan, of Union Lodge, and P.H.P. George H. Dushane, of Mageneu Encampment, and was headed by a section of the Marine Band, under the leadership of Frederick Prosperi. The pall-bearers were P.G.M. B.A. Kidder and P.G. John Shaffer on the part of the Lodge, William R. Newman and M. Mitchell for Magenenu Encampment, and Henry Wylie and F.C. Wood on the part of the clerks. The remains were taken to Congressional Cemetery for interment.
