### **Mrs. Walker's Funeral Rites Set Tomorrow**

Funeral services for Mrs. Sallie L. Walker, 89, a resident of Washington for 68 years who died Wednesday at her home after a long illness, will be held tomorrow at 10:30 a.m. from the residence, 420 B Street Northeast. Burial will be in Congressional Cemetery.

Mrs. Walker, a native of Annapolis, Md., was the widow of Samuel H. Walker, one-time major in the District Police Department, who died in 1938. She was a member of Waugh Methodist Church, the Board of Managers of the Methodist Home, Daughters of the American Revolution, First Families of Virginia, Colonial Dames of the seventeenth century and Daughters of the American Colonists.

She is survived by five daughters: Mrs. William B. Hardy, Rosa Lee Walker, Mrs. H.J. Walther, Mrs. Maxwell W. Winter and Mrs. McClain B. Smith, and one son, Arthur B. Walker, all of this city. Sixteen grandchildren and five great grandchildren also survive.

Mrs. Walker resided at the B Street address for more than 65 years.
