The Funeral of the late A.L. Walters (whose death was noticed in The Star of Saturday) took place from his late residence, on 10th street southwest, yesterday afternoon, and was well attended. The services at the house was conducted by Rev. M.L. Gardner, of Ryland Chapel, and the remains, escorted by Calanthe Lodge, No. 11, Knights of Pythias, headed by Donch's band, were taken to the Congressional cemetery where the interment took place. A beautiful pillow, a tribute from the Baltimore and Potomac railroad employees was borne on the coffin.
