Dr. Walton Is Dead; Former G.W. Dean Stroke Is Fatal to Dentist Long Prominent in His Profession Here Once Examiners' Head

Dr. J. Roland Walton, formerly dean of the George Washington University Dental School and for many years actively engaged in the practice of dentistry in this city, died yesterday at his home, 53020 Reno road, Chevy Chase, D.C. He suffered a stroke three weeks ago.

He was the son of Dr. John Randolph Walton and Mrs. Margaret Marshall Walton. He was born in 1861 in Leonardtown, Md. He was a direct descendant of Leonard Calvert and of the Duke family which, in 1634, came to Maryland with Gov. Calvert.

After he was graduated from the Baltimore College of Dental Surgery in 1886, he became professor at National University here. He held this position until 1903, when he was appointed professor in George Washington University. He was later made dean, and resigned the position several years ago.

He was formerly a member of the Board of Examiners for the District of Columbia and served as president of the District of Columbia Dental Society.

He is survived by his widow.

Funeral arrangements have not been completed.
