Widow of Thomas S. Warren Was Active in Church Work of City

Mrs. Elizabeth Langhorne Warren, eighty years old, widow of Thomas S. Warren and daughter of Col. James M. and Emma Norvell Langhorne, a prominent family of Lynchburg, Va., died at her home, 1444 W street northwest, Wednesday.

Funeral services were conducted at the Church of the Ascension, Episcopal, 12th street and Massachusetts avenue northwest, today. Interment was in the Congressional cemetery.

Mrs. Warren was the "choir mother" at the Church of the Ascension for more than twenty years and took an active part in church work until about a month before her death.

She is survived by a daughter, Mrs. Leonard Grover Barron of this city; a sister-in-law, Mrs. Norvell Langhorne, of Richmond, Va.; six nephews, James M. Langhorne and Charles Langhorne of Richmond, Va.; Warren Wellford and W.N.
