Mrs. F.V. Washington Dies At Home Here

Charter Member of D.A.R. and Relative of First President of United States

Mrs. Frances Virginia Washington, one of the charter members of the Daughters of the American Revolution, died at her home, 1133 10th street, February 8 after an illness lasting several weeks. Funeral services were held last Tuesday at the residence, the Rev. Mr. Hall, assistant rector of Epiphany Church, officiating. Interment was at Congressional cemetery.

Mrs. Washington, who for many years was a resident of this city, was related to the first President of the United States, being the daughter of George Washington of Windsor Forest, Va., and the grandniece of Gen. William Washington, who was spoken of during the revolution as "the sword of his country" Her mother was Cecillia Barron, a niece of Admiral Barron of revolutionary times.

She is survived by her daughters, Mrs. Fannie D. Wilkins, Mrs. Mary Washington Adams and Miss Elizabeth W. Washington, and one son, John Macrae Washington.
