Death By Drowning

On Monday afternoon a boy about ten years of age, named William Edward Waters, while bathing in the Washington Canal, near E street south, was unfortunately drowned. It appeared, from the evidence had before the Coroner, that the poor fellow, being unable to swim, had gone out of his depth, and there being none but small boys with him, he unfortunately sank, and could not be got out of the canal until he was beyond the reach of resuscitation.
