Death Takes Inventor

Charles A. Wayson Long in Government Service

Charles A. Wayson, 67 years old, formerly for 25 years a cabinet maker and elevator conductor in the Treasury Department and later employed in the War Department until his retirement on account of age in 1921, died at Sibley Hospital Thursday. Funeral services were conducted at his late residence, 114 F street southeast, this afternoon. Interment was private.

Mr. Wayson assisted in the construction of the Lemon Building on New York avenue between Seventeenth and Eighteenth streets. He was the inventor of a machine which simplified the making of flower pots.

He leaves a widow, Mrs. Annie E. Wayson.
